JUDGMENT ENTRY GRANTING LIMITED DRIVING PRIVILEGES

This matter came before the Court on the Motion for Limited Driving Privileges. The defendant provided proof of employment and proof of insurance.

The defendant's driver's license was suspended for months/year(s) effective Pursuant to R.C. 4510.021 the Judgment Entry of suspension is modified to grant limited driving privileges to the defendant as of the date of this entry. The defendant is granted limited driving privileges to drive as follows:

[ ] A. To and from home and work/school:

[ ] B. At times other than shown above within reasonable commute to Adult Court Services or Adult Parole Authority, Alcoholics Anonymous meeting, scheduled alcohol/drug treatment or counseling session and/or for medical reasons.

[ ] C. For the purpose of seeking employment.

[ ] D. For the purpose of taking a drivers examination.

In part, for this Entry to be effective, the defendant shall carry with him/her at all times the following documents for verification:

1. A certified copy of this Entry while operating a motor vehicle.
2. A work schedule as proof of employment hours and the need to use limited driving privileges during that time and a school schedule.
3. A contact name, address, and phone number for his/her current employer that can be provided to any law enforcement officer as verification that the Defendant is only using his/her driving privileges as enumerated in this entry.

Conditions:

1. The defendant must have an unexpired OL and be insured.
2. Must drive the shortest reasonable route between places.
3. Comply with any terms of Community Control and be current on fines and court cost payments.
4. The defendant may drop off/pickup children at school/daycare on way to/or from employment.
5. The defendant may pickup/drop off children at school/care provider/other parent's home for visitation up to one hour before or after time specified with court decree.
6. The defendant may refuel along route and purchase food items along the route.
7. Further, the driving privileges enumerated above are VOID if the defendant operates any motor vehicle with odor of alcoholic beverage on or about his person and/or operates any motor vehicle without his/her having insurance coverage or bond to protect other highway users while he/she is operating a motor vehicle.
8. The Defendant must carry this Judgment Entry at all times during driving.
